# NHDC LOCAL PLAN FINAL DRAFT

District Councillors will be voting to adopt the final drafted version of the local plan at a public meeting to be held on Wednesday 20th July at the North Herts. Leisure Centre, Baldock Road, Letchworth, at 7.30pm. Members of the public are welcome to attend. It is likely that the plan will include up to 2100 homes to be built around Cockernhoe, Mangrove and Tea Green. These have been included in earlier drafts. Elected Councillors will attend the meeting with an open mind, and vote after listening to the debate, according to the Council's code of conduct.
