


USE OF THE PAVILION BY THE WIDER COMMUNITY

CRICKET CLUB RESPONSES


Number of adults

9 responses




Number of children (under 18)

- The pavilion needs to be refurbished and rebuilt with better facilities. A separate access from the Hitchin Rd through the bottom of the ground would be ideal.
- For me the best outcome would be to demolish the current structure and build a modern bigger and better equipped pavilion that can serve and benefit the whole community.
- Make as inclusive as possible to local community with focus on young and old.
- Enlarge the changing rooms so they are fit for purpose. Add more changing rooms for ladies teams. Make umpire changing rooms fit for purpose. There needs to be thought to the fact that there could possibly be a match which would involve over 18 male and female and under 18 male and female players.
- Build a new one, optimising community use and achieving compliance with ECB minimum standards.
- I'd expand the size, do a deal with the pub to access alcohol when viewing a game, have a coffee shop function to encourage parents to stay during junior training/matches, hardwood floors throughout for easy cleaning (the carpet is grim). Increase the showers (possibly one big shared shower room with more taps that have a much higher flow). Add a music system for future hosted events. Ultimately make it a place that cricketers love to spend time in rather than can't wait to get out of.
- If children's activities occurred during school holidays I would take them to those.
- Update/Extend to incorporate coffee shop, a bar and to offer a wider range of food and snacks
- Extend backwards to improve changing, showering and toilet facilities for players and officials. Repair and refresh external pavilion.
- Ideally, the changing rooms would be twice as big, with additional changing and showering facilities for the officials and any female players. The toilets and showers would be upgraded and enlarged as well.
